If your child is absent a day, an excuse note must be turned in on the day they return to school. If no excuse note is received within 3 days of their return to school, the absence will be marked illegal and could result in prosecution charges.



Students are required to have a refillable water bottle with them at school every day. We have three water stations where they can fill their bottles up as needed. We will not have bottled water available.



Student Information Packets

Please remember to fill out the necessary forms in your child's student information packets and return them as soon as possible. It is very important that we have the most up to date information on file for your child. Also, don't forget to let the office know if your phone number, email, or emergency contact information has changed in case the nurse or office would need to contact you.

We realize that at times it is necessary to pick your child up early from school; however, we would appreciate your cooperation in scheduling appointments later in the day to avoid students missing valuable

class time. If you do need to take your child to an appointment during the school day, please send a note to your child's teacher and your child will be called to the office when you arrive. Please allow approximately five minutes extra when coming to pick up your child. You may need to provide identification when picking up your child so that we are able to provide a safe and secure school environment.

When placing your child on pick-up for the end of the day, <u>please send a note to your child's teacher</u>, or call the office no later than 3:00pm the day of.

- Please remember to turn in an excuse card or note if your child has been absent. If an excuse card is not handed in within 3 days of their return to school, it will be marked as an illegal absence.
 The school is required to consider three illegal absences as a summary offense for which parents/guardians or persons in parental relation will be prosecuted through the courts.
- 2. If you drop off your child(ren) in the morning, please have them to school by 9:00am. The bell rings at 9:00am and classroom instruction starts promptly at 9:15am. Teachers need time to take attendance, lunch count, have the students unpack their backpacks, and get settled. If your child is late arriving to school, a parent or guardian must walk them in the office to sign them in.
- 3. If you will be picking your child up early from school, please send in a note or email to your child's teacher and the office. This way the teacher can have any missed work ready for your child to take home. It's also helpful for the office to know that someone will be picking up your child ahead of time.
- If your child has an appointment during school hours, a doctor's note must be turned in for the time missed to be excused.
- If your child will be absent a full day because of a doctor's or dentist appointment, be sure to get a doctor's note for the absence. Doctor's note do not count against their total absences for the year.

- 7. If you are planning a trip and your child will be missing school, an Educational Trip forms must be filled out at least 5 days in advance of the trip, returned to the school office and then be approved by the principal. Forms are available in the office or on-line. If no form is filled out in advance, the days missed will be marked as illegal.
- Educational Trip absences do not count toward the students total absences for the school year. Although only 10 total Educational Trip absences will be approved per year.

Your child attends **Bart-Colerain Elementary**, which receives Federal Title 1 funds to assist students in meeting state achievement standards. Throughout the school year, we will be providing you with important information about this law and your child's education. This letter lets you know about your right to request information about the qualifications of the classroom staff working with your child.

At **Bart-Colerain Elementary**, we are very proud of our teachers and feel they are ready for the coming school year and are prepared to give your child a high-quality education. As a Title 1 school, we must meet federal regulations related to teacher qualifications as defined in ESEA. These regulations allow you to learn more about your child's teachers' training and credentials. We are happy to provide this information to you. At any time, you may ask:

- Whether the teacher met state qualifications and certification requirements for the grade level and subject he/she is teaching,
- Whether the teacher received an emergency or conditional certificate through which state qualifications were waived, and
- What undergraduate or graduate degrees the teacher holds, including graduate certificates and additional degrees, and major(s) or area(s) of concentration.

You may also ask whether your child receives help from a paraprofessional. If your child receives this assistance, we can provide you with information about the paraprofessional's qualifications. At this time, all teachers and paraprofessionals who provide instructional support are highly qualified for the jobs that they hold.

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) which was signed into law in December 2015 and reauthorizes the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1956 (ESEA) includes additional right to know requests. At any time, parents and family members can request:

- Information on policies regarding student participation in assessments and procedures for opting out, and
- Information on required assessments that include
 - Subject matter tested,
 - o Purpose of the test,
 - o Source of the requirement (if applicable),
 - o Amount of time it takes student to complete the test, and
 - Time and format of disseminating results.

Our staff is committed to helping your child develop the academic knowledge and critical thinking he/she needs to succeed in school and beyond. That commitment includes making sure that all of our teachers and paraprofessionals meet applicable Pennsylvania state requirements.



Character Counts - September

As in previous years, we will spend each month of the school year focusing on a positive characteristic. This program is also a part of our Anti-Bullying Campaign to proactively teach students how to be good citizens. For September, we will be focusing on self-control. After a long summer of activities and fun, it can be hard for some students to get back into the routine and constantly demonstrate the self-control that is required of them in the classroom. This, however, is an important life skill that is required of all of us every day.

To focus on self-control, teachers will read Decibella and the Six-Inch Voice (K-2) or I Can't Believe You Said That (3-5). Both books focus on various aspects of self-control. Teachers will follow these stories with discussion questions and activities to ensure students fully understand the concept of self-control and ways to demonstrate it.

To extend this concept at home, try having a dinner table conversation about times at home when self-control is required and what things your child does to maintain self-control. How can these skills be transferred to the classroom, cafeteria, or playground?

Classroom Counseling- September

This year, I will again be visiting classrooms to talk with students about a variety of topics in the areas of social development, academics, and careers. The following are the lessons/topics we will be covering in September:

Kindergarten - I will be introducing myself to students and talking to them about what the school counselor does.

1st Grade - In 1st grade, we will be talking about what makes each of us unique and to be proud of who we are, and the qualities we have to share with our peers.

2nd Grade - In 2nd grade, we will talk about encouraging others, recognizing positive characteristics and abilities, and then giving compliments to our peers. This is a great way for our students to begin strengthening their classroom families!

3rd Grade - 3rd Graders will talk about empathy and being considerate of how others are feeling.

4th Grade - 4th Graders will be talking about teamwork, and learners will have the chance to put their skills to practice with a hands-on teamwork activity.

5th Grade- 5th Graders will be thinking about time management and how to juggle their responsibilities and activities.

Minute Meetings

It is important to me that I get to know every Bart-Colerain Elementary student. To make this happen, I will be meeting with each student during the months of September, January, and May for a "minute" conversation. I check in with each student and ask them some questions about themselves, peer relationships, their learning experiences, and what they remember about various topics we discussed during classroom lessons. I look forward to this opportunity to connect with each student!
