Dear Swift Families,

September is Attendance Awareness Month, which is an ideal time to talk with your kids about the importance of attending school every day. Poor attendance patterns can have many long-term negative effects, but what we see most often is increased anxiety about school and a feeling of "not fitting in". If there is something causing your child to miss school frequently, we encourage you to communicate with us so that we are best able to support them.

According to Attendanceworks.org:

- By 6th grade, chronic absence becomes a leading indicator that a learner will drop out of high school.
- Absenteeism in the first month of school can predict poor attendance throughout the school year. Half the students who miss 2-4 days in September go on to miss nearly a month of school.
- When learners improve their attendance rates, they improve their academic prospects and chances for graduating.
- By 9th grade, attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.

Three Ways to Encourage Positive Attendance:

- Make school attendance a priority. Focus on routines, consistent sleep schedules, and pushing through the mornings when motivation is tough.
- 2. Communicate with the school. Let us know if there are concerns, and seek out support if there is a reason why attendance is poor.
- 3. Enforce positive attendance and have consequences for missing school unnecessarily.

We look forward to continuing to support your child/ren throughout the year in maintaining positive attendance habits.
