7th Grade Team News

ELA - In May and June, students will conclude the year with the second half of our Fiction unit. We will review terms like theme, plot, characters, figurative language and tone. This will all be done through our final novel, Call of the Wild by Jack London.

Math - In math class, we are completing an algebra unit on writing and graphing equations in slope-intercept form. Once this unit is completed we will spend some time reviewing what we learned this year and taking the final exam.

LEAD - Students in LEAD will complete their reading and analysis of Island of the Blue Dolphins by Scott O'Dell. Next, students will enhance their communication skills by creating a presentation as part of our Speaking and Listening Unit.

Science - In May and June, the Swift Scientists will investigate how wetlands and local watersheds are impacted by the land use surrounding them, improving their environmental literacy. Students will then take action to change how they and possibly individuals in our townships use that land to improve the quality of the water and provide a more sustainable future for the local community and the organisms that live within it.

Social Studies - Learners will continue learning about European settlement with topics such as Jamestown, 13 colonies (upper, middle and southern), William Penn, and more. Learners will be assessed on their knowledge of the European Settlement Unit with a test in mid-May. The school year will end with a mini unit on the French & Indian War before learners take a cumulative final for their seventh-grade social studies class in the first week of June.

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8th Grade Team News

ELA -We will wrap up the year with our Drama unit ("Romeo and Juliet" by William Shakespeare) and our Short Story unit. Please be on the lookout for summer reading assignments at the end of May!

Advanced Algebra - We will be focusing on Keystone topics and preparations.

Pre- Algebra - We will finish our unit on exponents and move onto systems of equations.

LEAD - We will be ending the year by studying Greek Mythology.

Science - The SSI and its agents will be investigating a crime scene to collect and understand data on DNA, mutations, chromosomes, genetics, and development of species. We hope to solve the mystery of the thugs we have been chasing since the delivery of the suspicious package in September.

Social Studies - We are working on Western expansion with a project on the West! During May, students will be learning about Reconstruction and the early 1900s.

Geography - We will visiting our neighbors to the north and the south to end the year. Canada will be our first focus, learning the provinces, people, government and economy. Secondly, Latin America to our south will be the last unit, and we will also learn the countries, people, famous sites and important historic events from this region. We will compare the ways we (Americans) are alike and different from our neighbors.





Language Arts- The students will be reading <u>The Story of My Life</u> by Helen Keller to understand the characteristics of Literary Non-Fiction and finish up the year with <u>The Twenty-One Balloons</u> by William Pene du Bois.

LEAD- Students will be continuing their work on various speeches in LEAD class. In May and June, students will be finishing their informative speeches, designing a recording a travel commercial for a destination of their choosing. Additionally, students will finish the year by designing and recording a PSA for their final speech, a persuasive speech.

Social Studies- Social Studies will focus on the Dark Ages, Renaissance/Reformation, and Ancient Japan.

Science- Learners will focus on creating a website that highlights curricular concepts connected to our school's environmental site.

Math- During the months of May and June students will finish up their data and statistics project and take their final exam. Students will begin to work with negative numbers in preparation for seventh grade.
